

2018 Cannabis Survey Results


The City launched an online cannabis survey, which garnered 416 responses between April 17 and May 4, 2018. This documentation is a record of the feedback that was submitted.

In addition to the Cannabis Survey, residents were invited to join City Council and Administration for a 'Your Voice' public-engagement event on Thursday, April 19, 2018 at the LloydMall to review and discuss information relating to changing federal cannabis legislation and potential impacts for Lloydminster residents and businesses. Approximately 90 residents attended throughout the evening.


The following data, along with all recorded comments from the survey and the Your Voice event will be presented to City Council during a Regular City Council Meeting, and will be used as information in the decision making process.

Thank you to all residents and stakeholders who took time to provide the City of Lloydminster with feedback throughout this process.

Q1 Currently, cannabis stores in Alberta are permitted to operate between 10 a.m. and 2 a.m., seven days a week. Cannabis stores in Saskatchewan are permitted to operate between 8 a.m. and 3 a.m. Should cannabis retail stores in Lloydminster have similar limitations for hours of operation?



Q2 What zoning districts do you believe cannabis retails should be located?




Q3 Are there specific areas that you believe cannabis retail stores should not be located? If so, where?



The City of Lloydminster will compile the submitted feedback, and will present the information to Council where it will be considered in the decision making process.




Q5 Select any places you feel are acceptable for people to consume (smoke/vape) cannabis. Check all that apply.
